

Speech of 26 June 2008 - Reception of the President of the Cashmere

The parliamentary delegation which went to the Cashmere last May was very happy to be able to collaborate with your government. The reception on the spot was more cordial. That gave a special seal to our mission.

In our turn to wish you welcome in Belgium, more precisely with Brussels-Capital and more particularly within the Parliament of Brussels.

I in particular welcome the President of the Cashmere (Mr Zulqarnain Khan) like to his wife (Mrs Fakhria Zulqarnain), with the Minister of Pakistan, in charge more particularly of the Businesses of the Cashmere (Mr Zaman Kaira), with the advisor with the President of the Cashmere (Mr Z.U. Khan) like with its wife (Mrs Z.U. Khan), with the military secretary of the President of the Cashmere (Mr Muhammad Kaukab), with the director of Kashmir Media Concealment of Islamabad (Mr Shekh Tajamal), with the President of the Cashmere Centers Belgian in Brussels (Mr Ali Raza Syed) and finally with the Director of the Cashmere Centers in Brussels (Mr Abdul Majid Tramboo).

The objective of the second parliamentary delegation (Andre of the Bus and Danielle Charon) was to give a progress report on the progress report of the rebuilding of the Cashmere (after the earthquake of 8 October 2005) and to give the kickoff of an operation aiming at recycling the million tons of remains of constructions caused by the seism of 2005.

Concretely, the Belgian federal authorities financed crushing (405.000 €), the regional authorities of Brussels dealt with the financing of system of refining and sorting (50.000 €) and the Belgium Confederation construction placed at the disposal of the experts.

Thanks to the technology installation, these are the 80 tons/hour which are crushed by crushing which will spend eight month to transform the current remains. It will take three more years to transform the whole of the remains resulting from the future demolition of other buildings into bad condition.

The centre of recycling was inaugurated on 14 May 2008. A belgo-Pakistani convention relating to the conditions of use of crushing was also signed.

We are happy to announce to you that the Parliament of Brussels follows closely the progress report of the rebuilding of the Cashmere and mark its total support towards your cause.

This prevents by no means that good relationships between the Cashmere and the area of Brussels are not woven and are preserved.

It is really what we wish and we can say right now that true bonds of friendship were tied at the time of this second mission to the Cashmere. We very humbly offer - in our turn - our friendship to you on the ground of Brussels with, we hope for it, as much generosity.
